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What are Race Films?

Though there might be various definitions of race films, they are films created for a Black audience with a black cast, producer, director, writer, or cast. Race films can be created by white directors, producers, or writers.

What was uplift cinema and who was the target audience?

Uplift cinema is a movement in the beginning of the 20th century that focused on displaying a more accurate and positive portrayal of Black Americans in cinema. It prioritized representing Black American as **humans** who have separate and distinct identities but share a collective culture and history. It also functioned to reject the narrative, stereotypes, and scientific racism of the early 20th century. Uplift cinema's target was not only Black Americans but White Americans as well. It wanted to present these images to Americans in order to disprove the contemporary theory.

Who contributed to uplift?

Contribution to uplift cinema was not limited to anyone of a specific race or class. Many prominent individuals and film companies contributed and created many uplift films. The most prominent are:

Oscar Micheaux
